ABORIGINAL HEALTH CULTURAL SAFETY PLAN

January 2019 - December 2021

The following is a summary of objectives and key actions that underpins our Western Health's strategic direction to improve Aboriginal Health outcomes by providing a culturally respectful, high quality, safe, collaborative and holistic health care organisation.



OBJECTIVE 1

Western Health will improve communication and create a safe and welcoming environment that recognises the importance of the cultural beliefs and practices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

KEY OBJECTIVES

- Build an Aboriginal Health communication strategy informing internal and external stakeholders, cultural safety initiatives, news and events
- Support clinical departments to deliver and better understand cultural safety through cultural safety audits
- Develop systems and processes to seek and gain feedback about our services from Aboriginal consumers
- Re-naming of Aboriginal Health Unit in consultation with local Aboriginal Groups
- Explore opportunities to create an external environment that is culturally safe and welcoming – gardens, flying flags

OBJECTIVE 2

Western Health to have a culturally reflective staff and volunteer workforce.

KEY OBJECTIVES

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- Review and update content of training and development programs and activities. Introduce a tiered system to support delivery of regular on-line and face to face learning opportunities
- Continue to build on supporting school visits, health pathways and school based traineeships
- Evaluate and refresh current Western Health Aboriginal Employment Plan 2016-19
- All staff and volunteers have the opportunity to participate in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural events to foster greater understanding of social and cultural issues



OBJECTIVE 4

Western Health will improve access to culturally appropriate services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

KEY OBJECTIVES

- Explore programs that support Aboriginal consumers accessing outpatient services
- Continue, expand and extend 'Aboriginal Identification' training to improve identification at all entry points
- Identify regional partnerships and how we can deliver culturally responsive support services care and needs

OBJECTIVE 3

Western Health has evidence of Aboriginal Health quality improvement, planning and research.

KEY OBJECTIVES

- Ensure that our policies and procedures support cultural safety
- Build effective partnerships to enhance Aboriginal Health research and funding opportunities



EVALUATING AND REPORTING

Measuring and evaluating on the progress and success of this plan will occur through a variety of reporting mechanisms via:

- Western Health Aboriginal Health Steering Committee
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Community
