

REFERRAL GUIDELINES LUNG CANCER SERVICE

Patients presenting with the following RED FLAGS require <u>immediate</u> referral to the Emergency Department:

- Moderate or severe haemoptysis
- Stridor
- Respiratory distress
- Symptoms of superior vena cava obstruction.

All other patients should be referred to Outpatients. Patients being referred for suspected cancer are considered urgent referrals. See more information about cancer referral processes **here**.

Include details from the following categories (if relevant) in addition to standard referral information.

Please include as much detail as possible to assist us to accurately triage the referral and to prioritise urgent appointments.

For suspected/new early lung cancer, referral to either Respiratory Clinic OR Thoracic Surgery is appropriate.

Known metastatic lung cancer should be referred to Lung Oncology Clinic.

- Referral purpose

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INCLUDE IF PRESENT

Symptoms, signs and duration

 Weight loss or any other symptoms or signs. Refer to the Optimal Care Pathway for other possible signs/symptoms. Click <u>here</u> for link.

Relevant past medical history:

• E.g.: cancer, smoking, COPD, occupational exposure

Symptoms or signs suggestive of metastasis from a lung cancer



PROVIDE

Provide images on film/disk + copy of report. Relevant investigations include:

- Chest X-ray
- Contrast spiral CT of the chest and upper abdomen

If possible, request patients bring images on film/disk to Radiology (ground floor) at either Sunshine or Footscray Hospitals **prior** to their Outpatient appointment and request the images be scanned in. If this is not possible, ensure patients bring their films/disk to their outpatient appointment.

If images are not available, please include results with referral.
