Paediatric Cardiology Clinic at Western Health:

Western Health provides Specialist Cardiology Clinic services for patients up to 17 years of age who require specialised assessment and management of actual, or suspected heart disease. The clinics are facilitated by Paediatric Cardiologists.

Referrals will be triaged by a Paediatric Cardiologist according to specific clinical requirements.

Referrals may be triaged to alternative Paediatric Specialist Clinics at Western Health.

Specialist Clinics are provided in the Joan Kirner Women's & Children's Sunshine Hospital.

Conditions not seen by Paediatric Cardiology at Western Health:

• Children requiring 24 hour blood pressure monitoring - refer to the Nephrology department at the Royal Children's Hospital via <u>RCH Specialist Clinics Referrals</u>.

Acute conditions requiring immediate assessment – please refer the patient to the Sunshine Hospital Emergency Department.

NOTE: All paediatric cardiac emergencies and suspected cardiac emergencies must be referred to the Royal Children's Hospital Emergency Department.

Western Health Specialist Clinics Access & Referral Guidelines

The clinical information provided in your referral will determine the triage category.

The triage category will affect the timeframe in which the patient is offered an appointment.

If key information is missing, you will be asked to return the referral with the required information. If this information is not received, the referral may be rejected.
