EASING OF RESTRICTIONS IN THE COMMUNITY:

- As the restrictions in the community continue to ease, some restrictions within healthcare settings remain in place
- You will be notified once DHHS ease restrictions in healthcare setting. In the meantime please continue to follow the information below

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Students are required to familiarise themselves with and adhere to the guidelines outlined in the table above
- Students <u>are now able to attend ANC with their CoCe's</u> for face to face appointments, however, if your CoCe woman has an exception for their support person to attend ANC, you will not be able to attend due to room capacity restrictions
- When you attend the hospital, please ensure you are <u>signing into the CoCe sign in folder that is kept with the</u> <u>AMUM in ANC and at MAC ward clerk's reception near the printer</u>. This is a requirement for all students to complete every time they enter the hospital with their CoCe women
- Please always carry your CoCe orientation card on you every time you enter the hospital
- If you a primary close contact or are COVID-19 positive, you must not attend JKWC with your CoCe woman
- All students and staff are now required to wear a N95 masks and eye protection (googles or face shield) when they are in JKWC with their CoCe woman. N95 masks are kept at the main entrance of JKWC or on the wards and single use face shields are stored on level 3. If you are unable to find a face shield please contact the education team

- If your CoCe woman is a suspected or confirmed Covid-19 case, you are not permitted to attend the hospital for their labour and birth
- If you enter into a tea room during your time at JKWC you will be required to check in using the QR code.

FURTHER REMINDERS:

- If you have completed the WH welearn orientation package and have attended the CoCe orientation zoom session with an educator, you will be expected to be involved in the care of your woman. You are also permitted to attend elective C/S with your woman. Refer to the JK CoCe guide and information booklet for further expectations. This document has been made available by the University on your communication portal.
- If your CoCe woman is booked in for an elective C/S the requirements for attending JKWC are the same, however, you must sign into the CoCe folder on level 3 before presenting to level 2 of JKWC (theatre). Introduce yourself to the ward clerk and they will direct you where to go
- Midwifery students who are attending the hospital with their CoCe women are not recognised as support people.
 You are attending the hospital to provide care to your women therefore you are not included in the support people restrictions.

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
