Kevin McCaul Prize

Congratulations to registrar Divya Iyer has been awarded the 2024 National Kevin McCaul Prize from the Australian Society of Anaesthetists (ASA) for her work "Ergometrine and coronary artery vasospasm in pregnant and recently pregnant patients – A narrative review and case report".

This prize was instituted in 1978 by the ASA and is awarded to the highest ranked application for a research project, publishable critical review/essay on any aspect of anaesthesia, pain relief, physiology, or pharmacology relevant to the female reproductive system. It is open to ASA members who are Trainee Members or specialists within 2 years of obtaining their higher qualification in anaesthesia.

Study Coordinator Award by Breast Cancer Trials (BCT) Australia

This award acknowledges outstanding commitment to BCT's research program by a study coordinator at a participating institution.

The 2024 recipient is Ms Lisa Wilkinson. Lisa has been a member of BCT 1996 and has over 25 years of experience as a Clinical Trials Coordinator involving a range of cancer types.

This procedure is for WH staff undertaking research who seek WH sponsorship for an investigated initiated clinical research or trial. It describes what the Office for Research will implement to determine the capacity of WH to as a study sponsor.

This procedure has had a minor revision to better reflect the nature of the document content and the information provided in the overview statement.

<u>Updated SOPs – Good Clinical Practice</u>

We have revised all trials related SOPs to support our researchers in conducting clinical trials at WH.

The Office for Research will close for business from 12PM Monday 23 December 2024 and reopen Monday 06 January 2025.

Closing dates for new submissions:

- QA/MRR: Friday 22 November
- Low Risk: Friday 22 November
- SSA Governance: Friday 29 November
- Post Approval & Honorary Appointment: Friday 13 December

All new submissions will reopen on Monday 27 January 2025.

ALL urgent & commercial submissions can be submitted at any time but please note these reviews may take longer than usual.
