## Our commitment to safeguard children and young people

At Western Health, we are guided by our commitment and responsibility to providing a safe environment for the children and young people who are involved in our services, sites and operations.

We commit to doing everything possible to provide an environment for children and young people that is caring, nurturing and safe and we commit to accept accountability for this.

We commit to actively safeguard all children and young people from:

- Sexual abuse
- Physical abuse
- · Emotional or psychological abuse
- Nealect
- Witnessing violence

We commit to requiring all of our employees and volunteers to act to safeguard children and young people from harm by:

- Following all legislative mandatory reporting requirements and reporting all incidents of abuse or neglect of children to the appropriate authorities
- This applies to whether that abuse is being perpetrated by Western Health personnel, or by those outside the organisation, including those from the child's family, extended family; their family's extended networks or strangers.
- We will also prioritise, recognise and support the additional vulnerabilities and needs of children and young people who are Aboriginal and or of Torres Strait Islander decent; those who are from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds; children and young people who have a disability, and those who are of a diverse gender identity or sexual orientation.
- Empowering children and young people to actively participate in decisions that affect their care and wellbeing.
