Haematemesis and/or melaena.

Patients who are clinically unstable.

#### **Access & Referral Priority for Oesphageal and Gastric Cancers Service:**

The clinical information provided in your referral will determine the triage category. The triage category will affect the timeframe in which the patient is offered an appointment.

**URGENT** 

Appointment timeframe 30 days	Appointment timeframe greater than 30 days, depending on clinical need.
Any patient with symptoms indicating a suspicion of	
oesophageal or gastric cancer.	<ul> <li>Persistent epigastric pain/ dyspepsia –</li> </ul>
	despite 4 weeks PPI
Endoscopic evidence of suspected	Pain on swallowing
malignancy or biopsy proven cancer	<ul> <li>Food bolus obstruction</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>New onset or rapidly progressive dysphagia</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Anaemia – haemodynamically stable</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>New onset or rapidly progressive epigastric</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Unexplained weight loss</li> </ul>
pain(>2 weeks)	Early satiety

#### **Condition Specific Referral Guidelines:**

Key information enables Western Health to triage patients to the correct category and provide treatment with fewer visits to outpatients, creating more capacity for care. If key information is missing, you may be asked to return the referral with the required information.
