MORE TIPS

During the day, some people find that it is easier to carry the bottle in a pocket or bag, pinned to your clothing or hooked to your belt. Overnight, the drainage bottle can sit on the floor beside your bed, or be pinned loosely to bed sheets. Do be carefull however, to ensure the tubing is not overstretched.

After leaving hospital, the dressing covering your wound will be shower proof.

This dressing will be removed after a week, by your surgeon, or your nurse when removing the drain tubes at home.

Driving a car is not recommended until about 10 days after surgery, (depending on your flexibility and discomfort in your arm). Ask your surgeon when you can resume driving if you feel unsure.

Deodorant can be worn after the wound is healed. Roll on deodorant is easier to manage, as you can place it around the wound.

Shaving with a razor blade is not recommended as it can cause nicks in the skin. An electric razor or hair removal cream can be used.
