Autism Assessment Clinic (AAC) at Western Health:

Western Health operates a multidisciplinary outpatient **Autism Assessment Clinic (AAC)** for children who require assessment to evaluate whether they meet the diagnostic criteria for Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

The assessment team consists of a Paediatrician and two of the following disciplines; Speech Pathology, Occupational Therapy or Psychology.

Children will be accepted to the AAC if the following criteria are met:

- Referred by and under the ongoing care of a Paediatrician.
- Referral documents signs of ASD and include developmental history.
- Child is aged 2 years 11 months or under at time of referral.
- Child must have a referral to the Early Childhood Early Intervention (ECEI), National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) in place.
- Child must have been referred to or had an audiology assessment.
- It is suggested that recommendations for interim management including Speech Pathology (language assessment) and/or Psychology (cognitive assessment) will be made. Please see Health Pathways website for recommended guidelines/actions (https://melbourne.healthpathways.org.au/index.htm).

Referrals not seen at Western Health as services not provided:

- Children aged 3 years and over at time of referral
- Children requiring a formal cognitive and/or language assessment
- Children not under the continuing care of a Paediatrician
- Request for a second opinion of existing ASD diagnosis.

Access & Referral Priority Autism Assessment Clinic:

The clinical information provided in your referral will determine the triage category. The triage category will affect the timeframe in which the patient is offered an appointment.
